What is and why do we need an Architectural Review Committee?

Florida Status 720.3035 and our Bylaws, Article X paragraph a dedicates the establishment of an Architectural Committee.

The Architectural Committee comprises of a chairperson nominated by the Board and two or more committee members nominated by the chairperson. They are your neighbors who volunteer their expertise and time to help keep Anchorage a desirable place to live.

Their function is, "look at all requests for major exterior home modification, additions and changes that alter the general appearance of the property, whether or not it is the dwelling or landscaping. It is not limited to fences and sheds".

Over the past several months we have had numerous residents make improvements to their home, i.e., replace roofs, add sidewalks, painting their residences, putting up fences (vinyl and wire), and putting in new landscaping that did not follow the established Deed Restriction procedures. The purpose of these Restrictions is to ensure the attractiveness of the area for ourselves, to prevent nuisances, to maintain fair and adequate property values, to maintain the desired appearance of the community, and thereby to secure to each property owner the full benefit and enjoyment of his or her home, with no greater restriction on the free and undisturbed use of his or her property than is necessary to ensure the same advantage to other property owners.

If you are making improvements the ARC Request form is available on line (anchorage-hoa.com), you may filled it out right then and there and submit it instantly, or you may obtain the form at the clubhouse on the wall by the Library. It's a simple procedure to insure

that Anchorage maintains the beautiful community that it has been for years.
