Parking

The tip this month is about parking. Many of our residents either walk of bike ride around our community as a way of exercising and visiting friends and neighbors. We also have residents who use a walker to get some exercise. When cars are parked across the sidewalks, it blocks the pedestrian from walking and they have to move around the vehicle in order to continue their activity. The chances of them falling are greater when they have to maneuver around and walk on the decline of the driveway apron. For that reason, parking in a driveway that has a car protruding over the sidewalk is prohibited. Street parking is acceptable and is an alternative to blocking the sidewalk, just be sure not to block the mailbox or garbage on pick up days. Being a good neighbor is what Anchorage is all about. "Only Rain down the Drains" - I read an interesting article about road drains that I thought would be good to share. Yard waste such as fallen leaves, grass cuttings and pet waste can lead to nutrient problems that can lead to algae blooms and fish kills. If you want to know what an algae bloom looks like you only have to take a walk in John Chesnut park and look at the small lakes that have turned green. Debris that enters the street or a storm drain can cause blockages that result in street flooding. Pinellas County advice is for everyone to pick up and dispose of all debris. Leaves can be raked and disposed of or used as mulch in gardens. Grass clippings can be left on your lawn as they supply 50% of the nitrogen your grass needs.
