SCAM OF THE WEEK

Elections are right around the corner! (Yes, we need YOU!)

It's hard to believe that the Anchorage Annual Meeting is just a couple months away. This is when we select the next Board of Directors. One advantage of living in Anchorage is our low HOA fee. The reason that our fee is affordable is because our community is run by VOLUNTEERS, unlike most neighboring communities that have a paid professional manager and staff. So, what does this mean?

It means that the letter you got last week about age verification took Lisa hours to compose, print copies, stuff 248 envelopes, stick 248 stamps, take them to the Post Office, compile the data and nag the people who don't return the surveys. It means that Joe often spends 40 hours per week as our Treasurer, helping to keep Anchorage finances organized, accurate and solvent. It means that Mary sweeps the Clubhouse floor, organizes the cabinets, picks up around the pool deck, cleans the fridge, makes reservations and chaperones private events at the Clubhouse. It means that you'll find Bill cleaning sidewalks, spreading loads of mulch, repairing our irrigation system and troubleshooting electrical problems. It means that Gary spends hours answering inquiries, replying to correspondence, and working with residents as an unpaid community manager.

Prior to moving to Anchorage, many of us mowed our own lawns. After moving here, many decided that lawn mowing was difficult, so they hired a lawn-maintenance company, and paid the bill. Anchorage is in a similar position. In the past, we've been fortunate that residents have come forward to assist the community, but now's the time to volunteer! No volunteers? No problem! We'll have to be like the surrounding communities and hire a professional community manager and staff at an estimated cost of \$75,000 per year. Please do your part. Volunteer for the Board!
